



# WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR WASTE?

How to recycle properly!



## Paper and cardboard → blue bin

Includes newspapers and magazines, catalogues, brochures, envelopes, notices, collapsible boxes, boxes (disassembled), egg cartons made from cardboard packaging, clean paper bags

**Emptied once a month**



## Packaging → yellow bin

Includes yoghurt, cream and quark tubs, milk and juice cartons, fruit, vegetable, sausage and meat packaging, cans, aluminium foil, cling film, tubes, plastic bags, screw caps, freezer packaging

**Bins and yellow bags are emptied once a month, large yellow containers are emptied twice a month.**



## Organic waste → green bin

Includes fruit and vegetable peelings such as potato or banana peel, spoiled leftovers, lettuce leaves, tea and coffee grounds, paper napkins, paper towels, small quantities of grass and shrub cuttings, leaves, flowers

**Emptied twice a month**



## Non-recyclable waste → grey bin

Includes rubbish, vacuum cleaner bags, ash, cigarette butts, nappies, plasters, sanitary items, porcelain, light bulbs, candle remains, cleaning sponges

Bins are typically emptied every 14 days, containers are emptied once or several times a week.



## Glass → separated by colour in the glass containers

Includes disposable bottles such as wine bottles, marmalade and gherkin jars



## Hazardous substances → Recycling centre

Includes batteries, ink, paint, pesticides, household chemicals, fluorescent tubes, energy-saving bulbs, electric devices

Batteries can be returned to retailers for disposal.

**Before throwing any items away:

Consider the swapping and selling market, second-hand shops give these items a second lease of life by donating to charity organisations!

## Faulty large electrical appliances → Recycling centre

Includes dishwashers, washing machines, fridges, dryers, cookers, TVs, computers, HiFi equipment

Common household appliances are taken to the recycling centres free of charge (see addresses above).

Collection can also be arranged online or by phone (+49 (0)228 – 555 27 20).

## Faulty small electrical appliances → Recycling centre

Includes mobile phones, razors, toasters, irons, hairdryers, portable radios, radio alarms, coffee machines

These can be taken to the recycling centre or disposed of in the red bins.

## Bulky waste

Bulky household items that are too large for the non-recyclable waste bin can be collected from your door at no extra cost: includes wardrobes and kitchen cupboards, tables, shelves, chairs, empty washing baskets, nightstands, mattresses, bed frames

You can find collection dates for your area in the waste planner.

(Weststraße 11, Entrance via Südstraße)

Monday to Friday: 8.00 to 17.00

Saturday: 8.00 to midday

Both recycling centres are **closed** on Sundays, Rose Monday, Christmas Eve, New Year's Eve and all public holidays, open from 8.00 to midday on Weiberfastnacht.
